<b>blackboard</b>	A blackboard would be seen in almost every classroom in the 1960s. Today we have screens or an interactive whiteboard.		
<b>chalk</b>	Chalk was used by teachers to write on the blackboard. It was mainly white but there many colours of chalk.		
<b>inkwell</b>	Many desks had a hole in the top right hand corner for ink. This was known as the inkwell.	Links to core values: Love – how can we show love to different generations? Respect – how can we show respect towards life in the past? Kindness – How can we show kindness to everyone?	
<b>pen and nib</b>	In most schools children used pens and ink to write. The pens had a nib at the end which was replaced from time to time. <b>record player</b>	This was a machine which had a turntable and a stylus which balance on the groves of a record and played the music on the record.	• The England football team won the World Cup in 1966. <b>tape recorder</b>	This was a machine which wound the spool which were tapes. You could record music or speaking on to the tape.	• It was very rare for people to go to a restaurant in the 1960s. 'Meat and two veg' was a common term to describe a roast meat meal. Prawn cocktail started to be eaten as a starter.	
<b>marbles</b>	Another popular game was marbles. Many children came to school with a pocketful of marbles.	• Fashion changed greatly in the 1960s. After the war, people didn't have money to spend on clothes but that changed in the 1960s with colourful, hippie style clothes being very popular	<b>Cross curricular links</b>
<b>ludo</b>	Another very popular board game. It was used with a dice. Children would chase each other around the board.	• The mini car was very fashionable in the 1960s. • The first humans landed on the moon on July 20 <sup>th</sup> 1969. Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin walked on the moon. Michael Collins orbited the moon so that he could join up with them again to bring them back to earth.
